NEW DRAMA WORKS

Since it's inception in 1996 I have facilitated this program, which was created to encourage and stimulate the production of original works. All playwrights need a habitable place where the words on the page take voice for the first time on stage. This moment is theatre itself. We are very proud to have provided this New Drama Works Program to recognize and develop the playwright's voice. We produce ten staged readings a year of new work with our company of actors and directors. The SCRipts Festival culminates with two fully staged productions that have been submitted for this international competition. I directed the following festival winners: *Electronic Roses* by Michael Busby (1997), and *Repertory!* By John Moran (1999, 2000). *Repertory!* Won the "1999 Best Original Play" by the Press Democrat. In 2001, I directed *Seeing Stars in Dixie* by Ron Osborne, which was subsequently published by Samuel French.
